I have a Masters degree in social work and an Honours degree in Anthropology and I have been engaged for a number of years in the practice of psychiatric and medical social work and also as a university research anthrolopogist specialising in comparative religion. In particular I have spent 2 years of research for a Ph. D. in anthropology, studing the value systems and behavior patterns of disciples (sannyasins) of the Indian religious teacher and spiritual leader, Bhagwan Shree Rajneesh.
