To Whom It May Concern,


I am a psychologist and graduated from the University of Konstanz, West Germany in the summer of 1983. For the past year I have been participating in a training course of neo-Reichian massage and bodywork.

Three years previously I read of Bhagwan Shree Rajneesh in the context of my studies and my psychotherapeutical education. I became astonished regarding his profound professional knowledge in psychology and was very much impressed by his comments on almost every psychological question relevant at the present time. The results of his teachings prove that he is an expert in all existing psychological and psychotherapeutical schools and their work. He has managed to create a very workable synthesis of both eastern and western meditation and growth techniques.
